

Hearing Loop


The PAEC is proud to say that we are "looped!" Individuals with hearing loss may request a headset at the Box Office to which a wireless signal is transmitted from the theatre sound system. This signal can also be transmitted to the T-coil in an cochlear implant or

hearing aid. This system allows you to hear sound picked up by the facility's sound system, rather than from the microphone in an implant, hearing aid, or assistive device, resulting in a clearer sound with less background noise.
